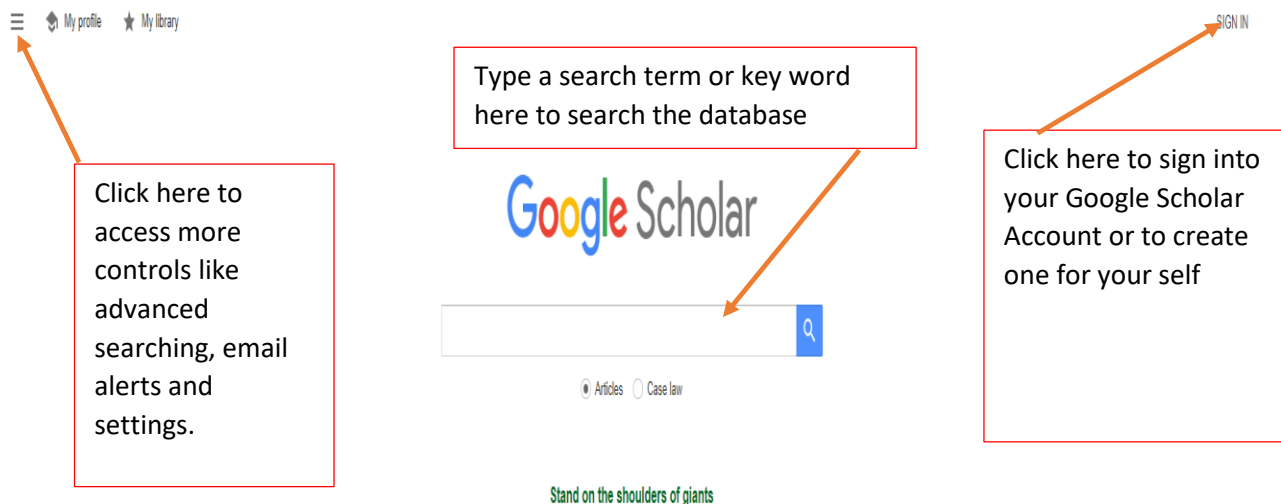


Kyambogo University Google Scholar Library Guide

Google Scholar is a search engine for academic resources that can be searched when conducting academic research. It is a tool students and academic teaching staff can use when searching for scholarly electronic and online resources. It provides resources you can access openly and those you have to first subscribe to. Please remember that Kyambogo University has a Documentary Delivery Service (DDS). In case you search for a resource on Google Scholar and find it restricted or closed, please take note of its bibliographic details and contact the librarian to see if it can be provided to you through the DDS. Please also remember that not all resources in Google Scholar are peer reviewed.

ACCESSING GOOGLE SCHOLAR

1. To access Google Scholar, you type [https://scholar.google.com/] in the URL box. A screen like one below will open.

2. Google Scholar allows users to make both simple and advanced searches. For example below, 'Domestic violence' was used and Google scholar returned 3,120,000 results. It also displays resources you can access full text on the right hand side and on the left are filters in case you want to specify the search by years, relevance and resource type.

 Domestic violence affects the lives of many Americans, including children. It is imperative that primary care providers working with children, including pediatric nurse practitioners, understand the dynamics of domestic violence, recognize domestic violence, and intervene appropriately. Domestic violence places children at risk physically, emotionally, and developmentally. The effect on children who witness domestic violence will be discussed. Primary care providers have a professional responsibility to screen for domestic violence. 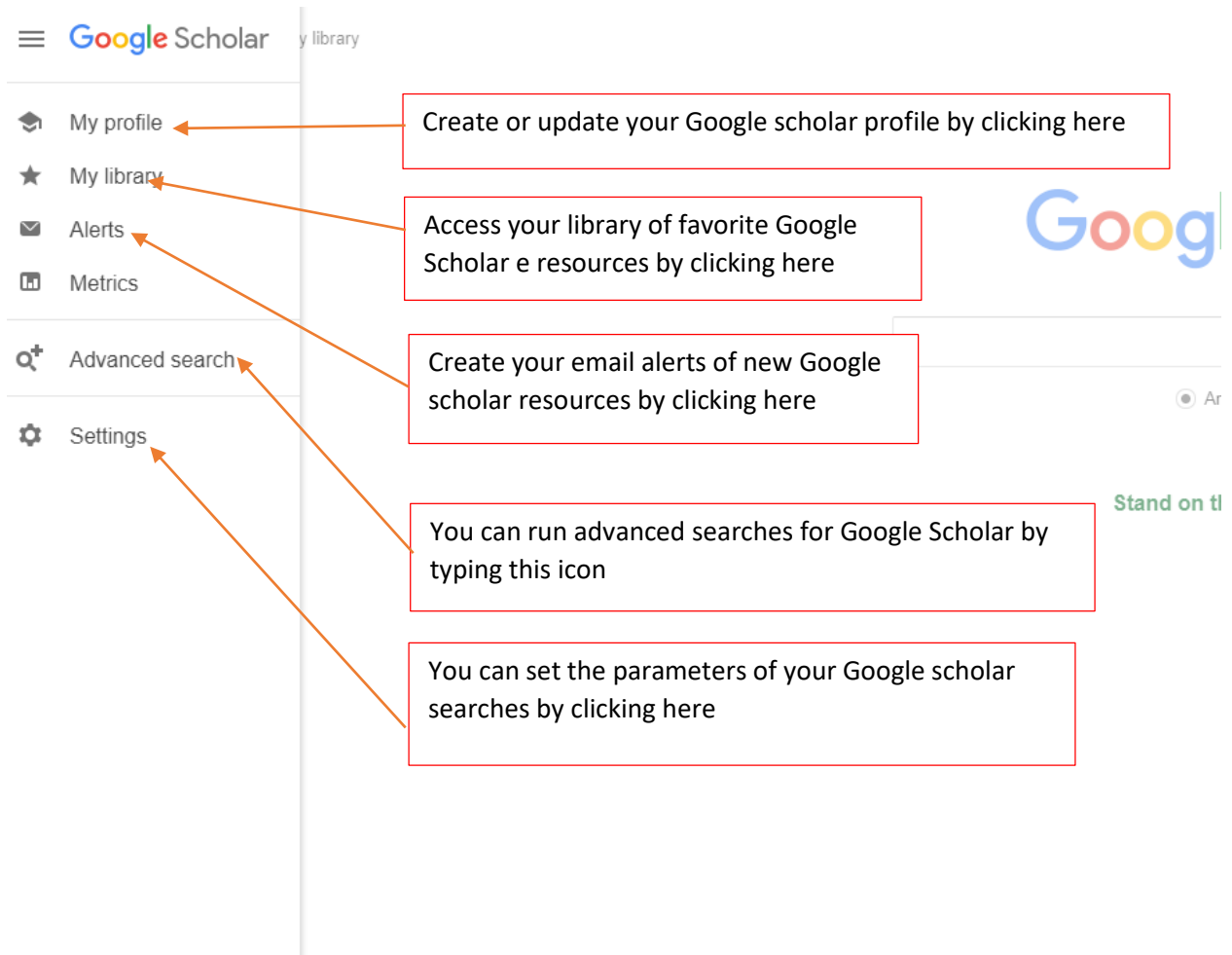
DEFINITION OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE
 Domestic violence is known by a variety of names: intimate partner abuse, family violence, wife beating, battering, marital abuse, and partner abuse, to name a few. Domestic violence is not any single behavior but rather a pattern of many physical, sexual, and/or psychological behaviors perpetrated by a current or former intimate partner (Rodriguez et al., 1999). Domestic violence is gender-neutral; however, women are more likely to experience physical injuries or psychological consequences (Rodriguez et al.). These assaultive and coercive behaviors are designed to manipulate, control, and dominate the partner to achieve compliance and dependence (Van...

Modifying Google Scholar Settings

5. When you click on the four lines at the top left corner, a drop down menu will appear where you can access different controls like; creating your profile, your library collection, email alerts advanced searching and settings



6. When you click on Settings, Google scholar can allow you to specify how your search results are displayed. You can determine which resource type to display, how many results per page and all other parameters.

- You can refine your search well by using advanced search. When you click on advanced search, Google scholar will allow you to enhance your search by including parameters of searching for exact words, searching for words in the title or body of the text, searching by author, type of resource and even years as illustrated below. In some Google Scholar versions, you can also activate the advanced search button by just clicking once in the open searching box of Google scholar

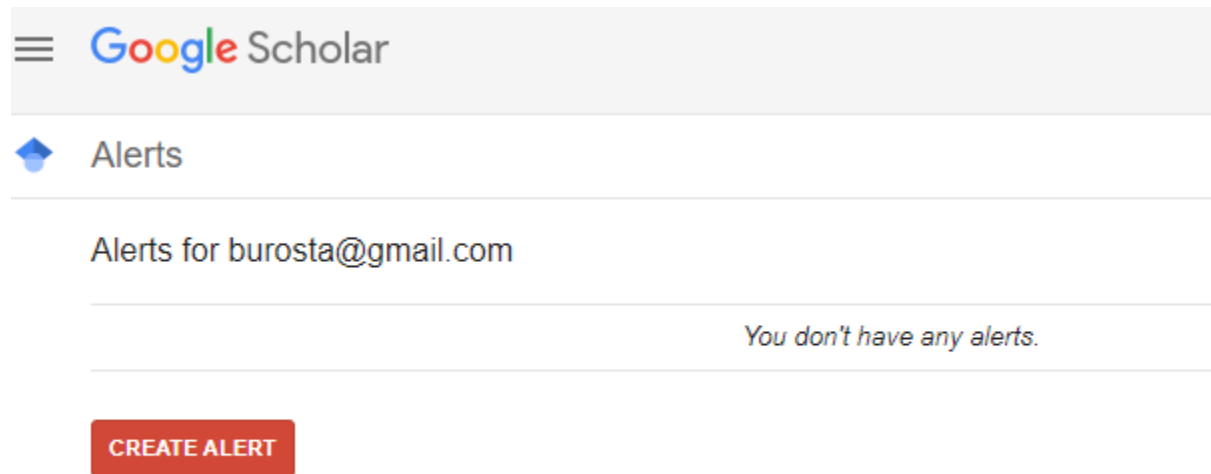

In the screen shot below, Renewable energy was used and after you click on create alert. Google Scholar will from time to time send alerts to your email of any new resources in that field.

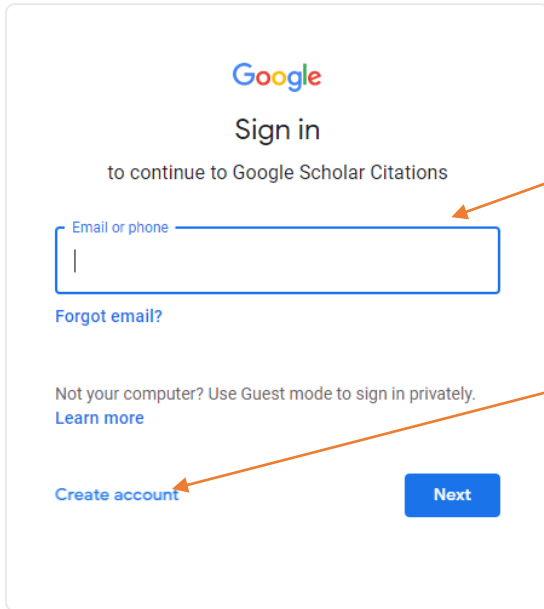
